Veterinary Exam \$40

Needed annually to prescribe medications

Technician Appointment \$20

For appointments that do not require a veterinary exam

VACCINES

Rabies Vaccine \$18

Legally required in the state of Virginia

Core:

Distemper (DA2PP) \$18

Leptospirosis \$18

Distemper + Lepto combo \$30

Lifestyle Vaccines

Likely needed for boarding and grooming

Bordetella \$30

Influenza \$38 each

BLOODWORK

Recommended annually for all dogs:

Heartworm Test \$30

Other bloodwork:

Chem 10 \$70

Screening test recommended every 6-12 months for apparently healthy pets on long-term medication, and geriatric pets (>8yo) to evaluate a complete blood cell count and organ function.

Chem 17 \$90

Screening test recommended for sick pets, geriatric pets or pets on certain medications which includes additional measures of liver function and electrolytes.

T4 \$25

Measures thyroid levels. Recommended for middle-aged to older dogs struggling with weight gain, lethargy or coat/skin problems which may indicate hypothyroidism.

Needed annually to prescribe medications

VACCINES

Rabies Vaccine \$18

Legally required in the state of Virginia

Core:

Distemper (HCP) \$18

Lifestyle Vaccines

Recommended for all kittens and adult outdoor or indoor/outdoor cats

Feline Leukemia \$20

BLOODWORK

FeLV/FIV/Heartworm Test \$30

Screening test recommended annually for indoor/outdoor cats for two viruses spread cat to cat that can affect the immune system, as well as for heartworms.

Chem 10 \$70

Screening test recommended every 6-12 months for apparently healthy pets on long-term medication, and geriatric pets (>8yo) to evaluate a complete blood cell count and organ function.

Chem 17 \$90

Screening test recommended for sick pets, geriatric pets or pets on certain medications which includes additional measures of liver function and electrolytes.

T4 \$25

Measures thyroid levels. Recommended for geriatric cats (>8yo) to screen for underlying hyperthyroidism.
